Our Heritage Advocates for Protestant families

The Saskatoon Society for Christian Education (SSCE) began its journey in 1983, driven by the belief that Christian families should have the freedom to choose an education for their children that aligns with their faith. Starting with just three rented classrooms in a local public school, the newly-formed Saskatoon Christian School (SCS) opened its doors to 33 students from kindergarten to grade 8, taught by two instructors.

By 1993, we achieved Accredited School status from the Ministry of Education and six years later joined the Saskatoon Public School Division (SPSD) as an Associate School. These two milestones set the stage for the development of our present day facilities, located on a 37-acre campus in Corman Park.

Over the next 15 years, as Protestant Christian values became less prominent in public schools, we experienced significant growth, with enrolment increasing to 400 students and staff expanding to over 50.

In 2019, our dedication to offering Christ-centred education diverged from the direction of SPSD. After losing our Associate School status, we renewed our advocacy for educational choice by engaging with the provincial government. This effort led to SCS becoming the first school in Saskatchewan to receive Certified Independent School status from the Ministry of Education.

Today, more than 40 years after our founding, we stand stronger than ever. With over 400 active members we continue to shape provincial policy, leading the way in securing Christ-centred education for Protestant Christian families across the province. Building on decades of commitment, we are excited to expand our impact, ensuring future generations of Christian students can thrive in schools where they are empowered to apply their faith to their academic pursuits.
